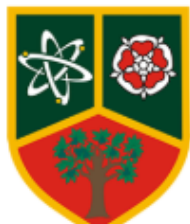

Word	Definition	In context
myth	An ancient story, especially explaining the early history of a group of people or about natural events and facts	The children enjoyed the stories about the gods and goddesses of the Roman myths.
ancient Greeks	A civilisation in the north-eastern Mediterranean existing from 1500BC to 300BC.	Socrates and Plato are famous ancient Greek philosophers.
Romans	A famous civilisation originating in Rome, Italy it was founded in 753BC and collapsed in 476AD.	What did the Romans do for us?
salve	'Hello' in Latin	Salve Mr Hughes.
Minotaur	A creature in ancient Greek stories that has the body of a human and head of a bull.	King Theseus was the legendary ruler who slew the Minotaur.
puella	'Girl' in Latin	Puella ambulat. Translation <i>The girl walks.</i>
puer	'Boy' in Latin	Puer cantat. Translation <i>The boy sings.</i>
Zeus	In Greek mythology, the greatest of the gods. The god of the sky and the weather.	Prometheus knows Zeus will be overthrown by one of his own sons.
